SPEAKER NICHOL: One minute on the bill.

SENATOR HARRIS: I strongly urge you to vote for this resolution. Let's get it out there and give some folks some options. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

CLERK: Mr. President, 471 was introduced by Senators Hannibal, Withem, Barrett, and Goodrich. (Read title.) The bill was first read on January 21 last year, referred to Government Committee for hearing, advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Hannibal.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: Thank you. Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, LB 471 was a bill, as you just heard, that came out of the Government Committee and became a consent calendar bill. I was thinking a little earlier that we have heard complaints sometimes about our system here being a Unicameral, that one of the potential problems of our system is that we can move too quickly to pass legislation and sometimes too much in haste. And I looked back at my first introduction of this bill and it has been over two years ago for a noncontroversial bill and it finally has come to the floor. And, as a matter of fact, the person who brought the problem to me and suggested it needed to be changed, that it was an oversight to begin with, passed away a year and a half ago, and it was a friend of mine but maybe this could be a memorial to him at this point.
