So I say that the commercial banks have the decided and unwarranted and unfair advantage at the present time and we need to open this opportunity up to the savings and loan industry of the State of Nebraska. Mr. President, I support the bill, LB 645, I urge the body to support it. Thank you.

SENATOR L. JOHNSON: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I appreciate very much the remarks made by several of my colleagues about the beneficial use of the provisions provided by this bill. I think the most important things were outlined by Senator Barrett and by Senator DeCamp. They can be summarized strictly as providing a freedom of choice in a new and strange - a perhaps of deregulation for all of the financial institutions. I urge your consideration and approval for advancement of the bill. Thank you.
