SPEAKER NICHOL: I don't think it really makes that much difference. If you're going to put it that late it's going to be in trouble, I think, just from the Speaker's standpoint.

SENATOR DECAMP: Ah, stranger things have happened, as you and I know.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Yes, that is correct.

SENATOR DECAMP: Okay, April 1.
