SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DECAMP: Yeah, Mr. President, this is the bill that was to save about \$6 million or 5 million for the Commonwealth depositors so that Lincoln and Lancaster County would pick up the back taxes on all that property. SPEAKER NICHOL: That's a long time. Bracket until April 15?

SENATOR DECAMP: Yeah.
