PRESIDENT: Thank you, Senator Johnson. The motion is the adoption of the Schmit amendment to LB 284. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Members of the Legislature, may I have your attention. The vote is on the Schmit amendment to LB 284. Have you all voted? Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 37 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: The amendment is adopted. Do you have matters for the record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Constitutional Revision and Recreation gives notice of hearing. That is offered by Senator Rupp as Chair. Your Committee on Urban Affairs, whose Chairman is Senator Withem, reports LB 399 indefinitely postponed. That is signed by Senator Withem.

Your Committee on Revenue, whose Chair is Senator Vard Johnson, reports 753 to General File, 819 General File, 774 General File with amendments, 54 indefinitely postponed, 222 indefinitely postponed, 400 indefinitely postponed. Senator Abboud would like to add his name to LB 91 as co-introducer. Retirement and Miscellaneous Subjects offer notice of hearing. Senator Vickers has amendments to 217 to be printed, and to 124. (See pages 481-83 of the Legislative Journal.)

The Business and Labor Committee, whose Chairman is Senator Barrett, to whom was referred LB 811, all 157 pages of that bill, have been reported to General File without committee amendments, Mr. President. That is all that I have.

PRESIDENT: Senator Schmit, do you want to move your bill off of Select File? (LB 284.)

SENATOR SCHMIT: I move the bill be advanced, Mr. Chairman.

PRESIDENT: I did not know we had other amendments, so I guess we'll just let that go now. If you want to go ahead with the amendments, we may have some to be withdrawn.
