I have notice of hearing from the Revenue Committee. I also have a motion from Senator Pappas to place LB 832 on General File notwithstanding the action of the committee. That will be laid over, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: While the Legislature is in session and capable of transacting business, I propose to sign and do sign LBs 729, 730, 731, 732, 733, 734, 735, 736, 737, 738, 739, 741, 742, 743, 744 and 745. And also let me remind you one more time that if you'd like, you may stop over at Room 2102 where the visually impaired are serving rolls and coffee for this morning, so if you'd like to stop over there and have a roll and coffee and visit with the visually impaired, you're invited to do so. Do you have anything else, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: No, sir.

SPEAKER NICHOL: In that case we'll move on to Select File, LB 74.

CLERK: Mr. President, on Select File LB 74, I have no E & R amendments. I do have an amendment to the bill from Senator Pappas. (Pappas amendment appears on page 573 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Pappas, please.

SENATOR PAPPAS: Mr. Speaker, colleagues, another little simple technical amendment. It is more than a simple technical amendment. Basically what it does is allow members in this bill, basically deals with one group of people that are not eligible for Social Security, that if they become medically disabled that they can continue on the group insurance plan at the benefit that they derive while they are working there. There has never been anybody yet in the history that was medically disabled that had to retire early, but that could come up some time. It is one thing the Lincoln Police Department has that other police departments have, law enforcement agencies, because of the line of work that they are involved with. I think it's something needed and I ask for the adoption of this amendment.
