CLERK: Mr. President, if I might right before that, your Committee on Government, whose Chair is Senator Landis, gives notice of hearing. Your Committee on Revenue, whose Chairman is Senator Vard Johnson, reports LB 888 to General File, 890 General File, 1028 General File, 824 indefinitely postponed, 863 indefinitely postponed, and 936 and 1044 as indefinitely postponed.
