CLERK: Mr. President, items for the record. Your Committee on Enrollment and Review reports LB 333, 333A and 546 as correctly Engrossed. (See pages 590-92 of the Legislative Journal.)

Mr. President, your Committee on Education, whose Chair is Senator Vickers, reports LB 887 to General File, 1093 General File with amendments, and 1092 as indefinitely postponed. (See page 592 of the Legislative Journal.)

Mr. President, new resolution, LR 332 by Senator Goll. (Read synopsis of the resolution. See page 592 of the Journal.) That will be laid over, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: We now go to consent calendar. May we have your attention, please. The usual rules pertaining to consent calendar bills is in effect, 15 minutes total speaking time. If the debate extends beyond 15 minutes, the introducer is not closing, the bill will be removed from the consent calendar. The first one is LB 469.

CLERK: Mr. President, 469 was a bill introduced by Senators John DeCamp and Jim Pappas. (Read.) The bill was read on January 21, referred to the Banking Committee, advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill.

PRESIDENT: Is Senator DeCamp here? (Gavel.) Senator Pappas, you want to take the bill? May we have order, please, so we may hear the speaker. Keep your conversational level low. (Gavel.) Senator Pappas.
