

February 11, 1986 LB 772, 818, 1236

PRESIDENT: The bill is withdrawn. Senator Rod Johnson.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Rod Johnson would move to withdraw LB 818.

PRESIDENT: Senator Johnson.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Mr. President, members, LB 818 was a bill designed to help the ethanol industry. However, after looking at it and some other proposals that have been offered by other senators, specifically Senator Pappas and Senator Schmit, it is my feeling that LB 818 could probably be better served in some of the other packages being offered and so I didn't feel it was necessary to take the time in this body to discuss an issue like this and also to have a public hearing considering that there are a number of other more worthwhile proposals. So I would ask unanimous consent to withdraw this legislative bill.

PRESIDENT: Any discussion on Senator Johnson's motion? If not, the motion is to withdraw LB 818. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to withdraw the bill.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries. The bill is withdrawn. We next proceed to a priority bill, LB 772.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 772 was a bill offered by Senator Chizek. (Read title.) The bill was read on January 8 of this year. It was referred to the Judiciary Committee for public hearing. The bill was advanced to General File, Mr. President. I have no amendments to the bill.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Chizek.

SENATOR CHIZEK: Mr. Speaker and members, LB 772...

PRESIDENT: May we have order in the Chamber, please. (Gavel.) We request that you keep your conversational tone down please. Senator Chizek.
