

not be necessary if several bills that are floating around become law, but in the event they do not, we ought to have this bill. We ought to advance it. I will explain the committee amendments briefly and then ask that they be adopted and hopefully the bill will be advanced. The committee amendments provide that the form for the payment of the heavy vehicle use tax shall be prescribed by the Department of Motor Vehicles as directed by the IRS. It also incorporates the heavy vehicle use tax provision into 60-305.9 which relates to the registration of internationally registered trucks. The amendment also deletes language referring to a requirement of odometer information appearing on a separate statement and I think you will remember when we had that bill before the body sometime ago. Finally, the committee amendment would exempt cash sellers of vehicles, three or less a year, from the penal provisions relating to failure to keep a copy of an odometer statement for five years. I would move adoption of the committee amendments.

PRESIDENT: Is there discussion on the committee amendments? If not, the motion is to adopt them. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to adopt the committee amendments.

PRESIDENT: The committee amendments are adopted. The Chair recognizes Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President and members, as I indicated earlier, several provisions of this bill are included in bills that are even now on Select File. If those bills advance to become law, this bill will need a major amendment on Select File and I will have that amendment ready at that time. If the other bills do not pass, then this bill will not require that extensive an amendment. I move the bill be advanced as amended.

PRESIDENT: The motion is to advance LB 300. Is there discussion? All those in favor of advancing the bill from General File vote aye, opposed vote nay. This is distinguished from Initiative 300. Have you all voted? Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.
