PRESIDENT: It all makes up for H2O, right?

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: That's correct. In any event, in any event, the Revenue Committee, a couple of years ago, concluded that oxygen equipment was sufficiently like prescription drugs, which are exempt from the sales tax, that we exempted oxygen equipment from the sales tax, but we didn't do it in a way that worked well. So Senator Hannibal had to come back with his bill to make certain we did it correctly and that is what LB 561 attempted to do but it still didn't do it correctly, so the committee amendments do it right.

PRESIDENT: Is there discussion on the committee amendments? There is an amendment to the committee amendment.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Hannibal would move to amend the committee amendments. (The Hannibal amendment appears on page 918 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR HANNIBAL: Mr. President and members, the amendment is strictly to change the enactment date from '85 to '86 just because it was originally on the docket last year and so it is just changing the enactment date to '86. I move its adoption.

PRESIDENT: Is there discussion on the Hannibal amendment to the committee amendments? If not, the motion is to adopt the Hannibal amendment to the amendments. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 16 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of Senator Hannibal's amendment to the committee amendments.

PRESIDENT: The Hannibal amendment is adopted. Now any discussion on the amendments as amended? If not, the motion is to adopt the committee amendments as amended. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the committee amendments.
