There have not been very many 49 vote bills that have moved across this floor in 18 years and I suggest, Senator Wesely, that when you find one of those you bring it to me and lay it on my desk and I'll lead a snake dance up and down the aisle here in support of the bill. But I think this is a good bill. It is a needed bill. We ought to pass it and I do not consider Dr. Wright to be the peak of all information in the State of Nebraska on public health and I would suggest that some of the rest of you might not think so also. I support the advancement of the bill.

PRESIDENT: Senator Sieck. Speaking order following Senator Sieck is Senators Haberman, Wesely and Hall.

SENATOR SIECK: Mr. President and members of the body, I'll have to agree with Senator Wesely. I think that we're a little too...proceed this too fast. A lot of us are not acquainted with what this is all about and I feel that Dr. Wright may be right. That's why he took the position that he did. I can understand Senator Schmit's arguments that some of these people might be trying to get into our industry, but I really don't believe that. I think they are conscientious people and people who want to help themselves as well as other individuals and as far as destroying our market I think that is furthest from the issue. I think really here is the place where we don't understand and I'm one that is not going to support the bill at the present time. Thank you.
