

and register your presence, please. We have three excused, is that correct? We're down to one now, thank you. We're looking for Lowell Johnson, Senator Johnson, Senator Chambers, Senator Conway, Senator Goodrich, Senator Hannibal and Senator Vickers, please. Senator DeCamp, Senator Chambers is the only one that isn't here. Shall we proceed?

SENATOR DECAMP: Oh, absolutely.

SENATOR CARSTEN: The question is the indefinite postponement of LB 958. We're going to have a roll call in reverse order. Mr. Clerk, you may proceed. Just a moment. (Gavel.) Please keep your voices down now so that the Clerk can hear your vote. Those in support of indefinite postponement will vote aye, those opposed will vote no. Mr. Clerk, please proceed.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken as found on pages 1360-61 of the Legislative Journal.) 30 ayes, 12 nays to indefinitely postpone, Mr. President.

SENATOR CARSTEN: LB 958 is indefinitely postponed. Senator Higgins, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR HIGGINS: Mr. President, I rise on a point of personal privilege.

SENATOR CARSTEN: State your point to the Chair, please. The call is raised.

SENATOR HIGGINS: During the recent debate, one of the senators made the remark about this being an election year and some of this voting because of that. And he specifically referred to some members on the floor running for the office on the second floor in the northeast corner, which would of course be the Governor's Office, and as everybody in this body knows, I am the only one left now of the Legislature that is running for Governor. I took that as a personal insult. If it would have just been left as those running for office, it would not have been so personal and I would remind the senator that made the remark, that if you look at the bill, some of the people who have contributed to my campaign as senator and as governor have financially supported my campaign, and yet today I have voted against them. In the past I have voted against workmen's compensation increases and unemployment increases.
