Chamber please return to your seats and press your green button. Unauthorized personnel, please leave the floor. Those of you who are within sound of my voice, please return and press your green presence button. We will accept call ins.

CLERK: Senator DeCamp voting yes. Senator Carsten voting yes. Senator Miller, you had voted yes, Senator.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 7 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance the A bill.

SENATOR CARSTEN: LB 219A is advanced from General File. Do you have anything to read in, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, first of all, I have a request from Senator Barrett to bracket LB 1126 until March 20, 1986.

SENATOR CARSTEN: No objection, so...Senator Hall, objects. Senator Barrett, do you want to...?

SENATOR BARRETT: Plead my case?

SENATOR CARSTEN: Yes.

SENATOR BARRETT: Thank you, Mr. President, and members, 1126, in my opinion, is a bill which is going to take an immense amount of time on this floor if it is discussed at this particular point in time. There are two sides which are now willing to negotiate. It is my opinion that by negotiating for approximately one week that the bill will be in proper condition, certainly in better shape than it is today.

SENATOR CARSTEN: The call is raised.

SENATOR BARRETT: Both sides and the primary introducer, Senator Howard Lamb, are in agreement. It is my intent to save this Legislature's valuable time, hopefully come up with a compromise. The bill should be ready for debate in one week. I would urge the body to accept the motion.
