ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read record vote as found on pages 1486-87 of the Legislative Journal.) 45 ayes, 0 nays, 4 excused and not voting, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: A majority having voted in the affirmative, the bill is declared passed. The Chair would like to announce that in the gallery this morning, in the north gallery, balcony, Mr. Dean Neff is there as the teacher and escort for 45 juniors from Central High School in Omaha of Senator Hoagland's district. Thank you for coming down to the Legislature this morning. If you'll stand, we'd like to recognize you and thank you for coming. We have about six more bills to read on Final Reading, which is what we are doing now. There is no debate. The bills have been introduced in committee, have been debated on the floor, and are now being enacted into law or possibly rejected on final vote. In about six bills we'll get into debate, if you can stay that long. Next proceeding on Final Reading is the reading of LB 816.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read LB 816 on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 816 pass? Those who are in favor of the question vote aye, those who are opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read record vote as found on pages 1487-88 of the Legislative Journal.) 43 ayes, 0 nays, 2 present and not voting, 4 excused and not voting.

PRESIDENT: A majority having voted in the affirmative, the bill is declared passed. We proceed to the Final Reading of LB 877. Excuse me, 820 is first, before 877. LB 820, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read LB 820 on Final Reading.)
