CLERK: Mr. President, just one item and that is, or a couple of items, I should say, Senator Rod Johnson has amendments to be printed to 937; Senator DeCamp to 880; and Senator Beyer to 1004. (See pages 1517-18 of the Legislative Journal.) That is all that I have, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: All right, let's go to our seats and be seated, please, and we will start Final Reading. Unauthorized personnel, please leave the floor. And I will continue to nag at you until you do return to your seats. I want you to feel at home. While you are returning to your seats, Senator Haberman has as guests under the south balcony, Mr. and Mrs. Donald Dixson of Trenton, Nebraska. Would you please stand so we can see where you are. We are happy to have you with us this morning. We are going into Final Reading which I am sure you will find interesting, if we get to our seats here shortly. While you are returning to your seats, it is brought to my attention that we have some people with the Council of State Governments with us under the north balcony. Virginia Thrall, I am sure several of you know her, and Michael McCabe. Would you folks please stand. I think our dues are still paid with the Council of State Governments, aren't we, so we are in good standing and we are happy to have you folks with us. Welcome. We will pass over LB 516. I understand some amendments are coming on it and we will go to 675, and you should mark your calendar that we will not read 757 and 757A because the bill has funds in it and we will have to pass over that until a later date. So we will start with 675. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read LB 675 on Final Reading.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 675 pass? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Record vote read. See page 1519 of the Legislative Journal.) 44 ayes, 0 nays, 2 present and not voting, 3 excused and not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: LB 675 passes. And when you return to
