But for the here and the now I think this is the way that it needs to be funded, that otherwise there is no assurance that we are going to get the other bill up or get the amendment on another bill. And this is a situation which will benefit some of those producers out there that really need it. You talk about the price per coyote. And I would agree that it is probably high. But the ones that cause problems are not the big majority of the coyotes. It is that one, or two, or three out of a county that is a killer coyote, those that are difficult to exterminate by the amateur. You just can't go out there and get those on a daily basis. They are the wiley ones, they are the ones that have been through special experiences that have become especially hard to capture and do all the damage. Most of the coyotes don't bother at least calves. That may not be true with sheep. But the worst coyotes are the ones that are very difficult to control. I would ask that this amendment be adopted.
