PRESIDENT: Yes, Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: If this is going to be a debatable motion,...

PRESIDENT: I know, I know what...

SENATOR LANDIS: ...as apparently it is, I'm moving to...I will withdraw my kill motion. This is the last motion on the bill.

PRESIDENT: Senator Withem, what do you want to do?

SENATOR WITHEM: Just a point of order. I offered a simple amendment to adjourn, which I understand is not debatable. The Speaker does have the right to read things into the record. I'd rather object to the last statement Senator Landis made.

PRESIDENT: The motion is not debatable. Does the Clerk have matters for the record?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Chambers has amendments to LB 1251, Senator Vickers to LR 16, Senator Vickers to LB 807, Senator Scofield to LB 894. Mr. President, that is all that I have. (See pages 1697-1702 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: All right. Just proceeding this vote, let me announce again, on behalf of the Speaker, that tomorrow afternoon we will take up at 2:00 p.m. and go until 7, through the dinner hour. The motion is to adjourn until nine tomorrow morning. All those in...is there...a machine vote has been requested. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 10 ayes, 23 nays, Mr. President, to adjourn.

PRESIDENT: The motion fails. LB 835 is still on the docket. Next. We are still on the Lamb amendment to the DeCamp amendment. And I guess I'll pursue names up here. I want to ask who wishes to speak further on the divided question, the second portion of the Lamb amendment to the DeCamp amendment. Senator Withem, do you wish to speak?
