SENATOR GOLL: Call the question, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. I think maybe it is not necessary, but I thank you anyway, Senator Goll. Senator Johnson, you may close.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: Mr. Speaker, I'm going to waive closing for the sake of time.

PRESIDENT: All right. Motion is to adopt the resolution, 384. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Senator Goll, before you leave, are your guests still in the north balcony? Very well, I'll introduce them now then. Motion is the adoption of resolution 384. Please record your vote. We have a motion here to adopt resolution 384, which has been under discussion. Please record your vote. Have you all voted? Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read record vote. See page 1732 of the Legislative Journal.) 25 ayes, 6 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the resolution.

PRESIDENT: The resolution is adopted. On behalf of Senator Goll I'm happy to announce that he has guests under the north balcony from Tekamah, his brother and his wife, Mr. and Mrs. Dick Goll, and Mr. Robert Maxwell. If you'd stand we'd like to recognize you and thank you for visiting the Legislature. We have a motion on 1129.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Vickers, I have two motions. Senator.

PRESIDENT: Senator Vickers, we have motions on 1129.

SENATOR VICKERS: (Response inaudible.)

CLERK: Mr. President, in that case, I have a motion from Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman, I wonder, before I make that motion, is it appropriate for me to ask unanimous consent to have my name added to 1129 as a co-sponsor?

PRESIDENT: Yes, it is. Is there objection to the Senator's request? If not, hearing no objection, so ordered.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Now that puts me in a position to explain
