Thirdly, is that interstate banking bill, 452. Friday morning, Select File priority again, two bills will come up at that time, Friday morning, 835 the telephone situation, 807 the caboose bill. This is where they come up in their regular order. Friday afternoon, Select File of nonpriority and that will be having to pick and choose some because we cannot take them all. Monday, April 7th Select File priority bills and in the afternoon at three o'clock, Initiative 300. The meetings that have been held during the past few days have not created much unity in 300 so we thought we would try to do that at three o'clock in the afternoon next Monday, April 7th, that way we can go as long as we want or as short as we want depending upon what we should do. Senator Rupp will be having some recommendations, and others along the line of what the Special Committee did a couple of weeks ago or about ten days ago, I guess it is now. So that is roughly what the agenda should be. We have about three days of Final Reading. We have eight days left after today. Subtract that, you have five days left. That is not very much for the amount of work we have to do. We have some 350 nearly, nearly 350 bills cooking between General File and Final Reading. That is not counting A bills. If you think we are going to get those all handled, we really must be on the ball. I encourage you not to talk at great lengths, make your point sure, I'm not trying to thwart discussion or debate at all. I never try that. Please make your remarks succinct and to the point and if you want to slow down the process, that is up to you. Those are your bills that are on Select File and I know a lot of you are interested in them. So I urge your continued effort, continued staying here on the floor more than we have in the past so that we accomplish some of the things that you want to have accomplished. I do appreciate your diligent work on these Appropriation bills, they are important and we will stay on them till we get them finished. Thank you very much.
