Mr. President, your Committee on Enrollment and Review reports they have carefully examined and engrossed LB 788 and find the same correctly Engrossed, 813, 925, 925A. I have amendments to 600 to be printed. And, Mr. President, a series of unanimous consent requests. I have requests from Senators Scofield and Baack to add their name to 122. (See pages 2017-18 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: Any objections? So ordered.

CLERK: I have a request from Senator Hannibal to add his name to 578.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Any objections? So ordered.

CLERK: And I have a request from Senators Peterson and Sieck to add their names to LB 911.
