

Pirsch to LB 956. Please record your vote aye or nay. Please record your vote. Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Pirsch's amendment.

PRESIDENT: The amendment is adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, I now have a motion from Senator Hoagland to suspend Rule 7, Section 3 so as to permit consideration of AM2977 to LB 956.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Colleagues, we have discussed this on the floor previously and you have had distributed to you a constitutional rewrite of the bomb threat statute in the State of Nebraska. The Nebraska Supreme Court about three years ago declared this unconstitutional. A bill came out of Judiciary Committee with no dissenting votes. I'm asking that we suspend the rules to put the terroristic threats bill on this bill so that we will not be without a bomb threat statute for another year. I'd ask that the rules be suspended.

PRESIDENT: Is there discussion on the motion to suspend the rules for the purpose stated? If not, the motion is to suspend the rules for the purpose stated. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. May we have your attention, please, to the motion which would suspend the rules in order to take up this amendment. Motion is to suspend the rules in order to take up...consider an amendment to follow. Thirty votes required. May we have your attention, please, to the motion on the floor. We need aye or nay votes from each of you on the motion of Senator Hoagland to suspend the rules to take up an amendment. May we have your vote, please, aye or nay. May we have the attention of some of the members who have not voted, please? Please record your vote aye or nay. Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to suspend the germaneness rule.

PRESIDENT: Motion carried.
