

don't, we give them an option. They can wipe their hands clean of it and send it to the Liquor Control Commission if they don't want to do it. But I think, and I know, that local government will take that responsibility. Also, like I told you before, our committee will be holding an interim study and will be getting to the bottom of this and let me tell you when we get it back it will be right. I urge for the advancement of this bill.

PRESIDENT: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DECAMP: Question.

PRESIDENT: Do I see five hands? I do and we have had about equal exchange on this bill pro and con. I'll put the question to you. Shall the debate now close? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays to cease debate.

PRESIDENT: Motion carried. The debate is closed. Do you have any further closing, Senator Hefner, or do you want to yield to somebody to close?

SENATOR HEFNER: Mr. President and members of the body, I'd just say to give local control, to have more local control, vote for the advancement of this bill.

PRESIDENT: The motion is to advance the bill from Select File to final Enrollment and Review. All those in favor say aye. Opposed...all right, just testing. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? A record vote has been requested. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record the vote, Mr. Clerk. CLERK: (Record vote read as found on page 2178 of the Legislative Journal.) 35 ayes, 12 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the motion to advance the bill.

PRESIDENT: The motion is carried and the bill is advanced. Are we going to LB 600A, Mr. Clerk? Okay. All right, we'll move two A bills, we'll go back to, and work on first. One is LB 31A which is on your front page under number six, Select File, number 31A, requiring Governor's budget to be based under enacted laws. 31A, Mr. Clerk.
