CLERK: (Record vote read. See page 2321 of the Legislative Journal.) 16 ayes, 14 nays on the motion to return the bill, Mr. Clerk.

PRESIDENT: The motion fails. We now take up LB 333. 1258A.

CLERK: No A bill. Mr. President, before I proceed, your Committee on Enrollment and Review respectfully reports they have carefully examined and engrossed LB 43, 43A, 300, LB 539, 870, and 926, and all are reported correctly engrossed. (See pages 2322-23 of the Legislative Journal.)

Mr. President, 333 is on Final Reading and I have a motion to return the bill. Senator Chambers would move to return 333 for a specific amendment, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: May we have order in the Chamber, please. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman, members of the Legislature, Senator Barrett and I have talked about this amendment, and what it does is to take some of those fees that are being used to collect money for this fund to deal with child abuse matters and say that after an amount of \$2,500,000 has been accumulated in the fund, these fees that have been attached to various documents such as birth certificates, divorce decrees, and so forth, or docket fees for divorces, will no longer be collected. So I am asking that the bill be returned, that amendment be adopted.

PRESIDENT: Senator Barrett.

SENATOR BARRETT: Mr. President, I consider this a very friendly gesture on the part of Senator Chambers. We have discussed it. I would urge the body to return the bill for the purpose of adopting the Chambers amendment. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: The motion is to return the bill to Select File for a specific amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Motion is to return the bill to Select File for a specific amendment. Please record your vote. Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.
