SPEAKER NICHOL: Debate has ceased. The question is the adoption of the resolution. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 32 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of the resolution, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The resolution is adopted. LR 424.

CLERK: Mr. President, 424 is offered by the Business and Labor Committee and signed by its members. It is on page 2182 of the Journal.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Barrett, please.

SENATOR BARRETT: Thank you, Mr. President, members. You will recall that each session we go through the labor contract negotiation resolution. And this is it. Section 48-837 requires that all labor contracts negotiated between the State of Nebraska and public employees will be subject to approval by this body. The Business and Labor Committee has had its public hearing on these contracts, and we are presenting to you, for approval, LR 424. I believe it is found on page 2182. I will not go into the body of the resolution, other than to say that there are 12 bargaining units in the State of Nebraska, 8 of these have now concluded their contract negotiations for the year '86-87. Those units are set out in the text of LR 424. There are three of the units that went to the CIR and they received wage orders for '86-87. And the final bargaining group has commenced CIR proceedings about two weeks ago. That, in essence, is the resolution. I would ask for its adoption. Thank you, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The question is the adoption of the resolution. All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 33 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of LR 424, Mr. President.
