PRESIDENT: Motion carries, and we will reconsider the vote taken previously.

CLERK: Mr. President, the motion now would be that the...that portion of LB 1251, which is the mainline appropriations bill with regards to the Commission on the Status of Women, the Commission on Mexican-Americans, and the Commission on Indian Affairs, that portion of the bill become law notwithstanding the objections of the Governor.

PRESIDENT: All right. Who is making that motion? Senator Lynch.

SENATOR LYNCH: Mr. President, I think we've already heard the discussion. I would ask for your return of those 30 green lights on the board. Thank you very much.

PRESIDENT: Senator Harris, do you wish to speak on the motion to override?

SENATOR HARRIS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I think we ought to move ahead with the vote. I commend Senator Lynch for taking the step as necessary to make this override possible. They fought long and hard for their position. And I always follow the lead of Senator Hall on his motions in regard to spending, and I agree with him that these people deserve this money. I strongly urge you to support the motion. Thank you.
