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debating,, or divorcing, or in crisis, cannot be involved in the conversation or fight back and so many of them turn to drugs, not so much pursuing pleasure but as anesthesia, avoiding pain. Others oof them turn to sex without love and make unhealthy and unwanted babies. It is short-term pleasure but long-term pain, but it's their form of avoidance. Whatever one's judgment about these chhildren may be, they are ours. Lastly, there is the challengee for us as a generation of leaders now that we are on the stage to define the priorities of our hour. There is a lot of focus lately on racial violence in New York and in Georgia. And as ugly and as sick and as immoral as those acts of racial violence are, they are illegal, and those who engage in those acts will face the judgment bar. Well, what is not being focused oor nearly enough is that the economic violence is even greater aard it is legal. To drive these farmers from their land with no place to go, no place to go, is legal. To close plants on workerrs and take our jobs to slave labor markets abroad is legal. People that die in an emergency room because they don't have a green or yellow card to go upstairs to a bed that is empty, waaiting for the rich to get sick, is legal. And so, just as 20 yeears ago, the focus was on our social and racial injusticee and we fought to make it illegal and now we must fight to upholdd those laws, this generation must fight to make economic violence illegal. While there is a lot of focus on Forsyth CCcounty, Georgia and Howard Beach, we are more locked over Walll Street than we are Queens, New York. When I look at the peopple at Howard Beach or Forsyth, or Harlem, (inaudible) my heart goees out, because, by and large, these people have felt the stinnq and impact of a million jobs that paid \$28,000 a year taken frrom them. They have felt the impact of 500,000 manufactuuring jobs, leaving. They have felt the impact of 80,000 faarm families driven from their land. So my appeal to you todaay, as a Legislature, given your role as really an internatiicnal Legislature because Nebraska is the heart and center oof our bread basket and, therefore, decisions made in this statte will be felt around the whole world, I appeal to you across llines of party, across lines of race, religion, region and sex ffor this generation to turn to each other and not on each other. Violence is not a struggle of black versus white, it is thee merge of maniacs versus the locked out. Those 25 billiooraires who become billionaires, not because they have done a biillion dollars worth of work but simply because they have manneuvered papers and figures and numbers in contrast to the 5 milllion homeless at the bottom and I would say if there must be a fight at this hour, let that fight not be a fight around raace, let that fight not be a fight at a pizza parlor or
