

wealthy people with \$90,000 incomes, or above, not to pay their proportionate and fair and progressive share of the income tax? And if you do not believe it's fair, if you think that \$4.3 million would be helpful somewhere in the budget to fund some kind of programs that are definitely needed, then I just ask you to support the amendment, vote it on its merits, not on other considerations unrelated to the amendment itself, considerations with regard to the Governor's office or the corporations in the largest city or those type of lobbyists that are trying to influence your vote. Look at the amendment. Consider whether it is worthy and I think if you consider it in all fairness and candor, you will vote yes for it. Thank you.

SENATOR McFARLAND: (Microphone not activated) to ask for a roll call vote in reverse order this time?
