PRESIDENT ROBAK: That is the correct motion.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The purpose is to allow for the introduction and the vote today on a legislative resolution. This legislative resolution is one honoring Secretary of State Allen Beermann.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: That is correct. The motion before you is a motion to suspend the rules. All those in favor say aye. Excuse me. That requires a machine vote. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: 37 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the introduction and consideration of LR 2 for today. (Read LR 2, see pages 15-16 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. This resolution is debatable. Is there any discussion? Senator Withem.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Madam Chair, I really do believe that the body of the resolution says it all, that Secretary of State Beermann has been an excellent public servant and would simply urge that the body, if this is my closing, simply urge that the body vote favorably on this resolution. Thank you very much.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Withem. Seeing no more discussion, the motion before the body is the adoption of LR 2. All those in favor say aye. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Please record.

CLERK: 45 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on adoption of LR 2.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: While the Legislature is in session and capable of transacting business, I propose to sign and do hereby sign LR 2. Senator Hartnett, it would now be appropriate to introduce your motion.
