

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Madam President, and members, the proposal that was introduced in 226 was brought to me by individuals representing the Western Heritage Museum and the Jocelyn Art Museum. They had asked that this bill be introduced back in about September or October and I did so. I didn't think I had to go back and check with them. Unfortunately, the issue, they feel, is going to cause them some kind of consternation as they go before the City Council tomorrow so they asked that the bill be withdrawn. I'm reluctantly doing that. I ask for unanimous consent to withdraw LB 226.
