vehicles on their flatbeds, lowboy trailers, but, as farmers who don't use their vehicles on a regular basis, these trailers and vehicles are farm-plated and they have been stopped by the Highway Patrol. They're being stopped by the...by the state people who check axles and weights and are being given tickets in violation. And I think it would be a tremendous asset to these people if we would provide them this exempt status and it will be a tremendous asset to the parades in that area of the state. And I think some day you're going to see a tremendous museum building built at the Interstate Interchange at Lexington, Nebraska, and if you're interested in old military vehicles, it will be an asset to tourism in the State of Nebraska. So it's a very simple bill. I think it should be supported.
