

Mr. President, a new bill. (Read LB 886 by title for the first time.) Finally, Mr. President, Senator Bernard-Stevens would like to print amendments to LB 144 in the Legislative Journal. That's all that I have, Mr. President. (See page 562 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you. LB 65, Mr. Clerk, I think there is a motion to indefinitely postpone. If you wouldn't mind, we'll just ask the sponsor, at this point, whether he'd like to take the bill up today or lay it over.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: I'd like to lay it over, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Save time going through the preliminaries then, we'll do those when it comes back up again. Next bill, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 53, introduced by Senator Kristensen. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 5 of this year, at that time referred to the Government, Military and Veterans Affairs Committee. The bill was advanced to General File. There are committee amendments pending by the Government, Military and Veterans Affairs Committee.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Robinson. Stand at ease one second, I think the Government Committee, I think, is in Exec Session and...Senator Robinson.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Mr. President, members of the body, I move the committee amendments for LB 53. The first part...the first change it strikes the language that allows the commission to employ personnel and have office space and necessary equipment furnished to it. That's found on page 2, lines 22 to line 26. Second part would be the commission must make its report to the Executive Board two years after the adjournment of the 1995 session instead of one year. That's found on page 3, line 2, just changing the number from one to two. Third part would be the amendment also removes language that would indicate that the Legislature is to call a constitutional convention when it receives the recommendations from the commission. That's on page 3, line 5, starting with "it" and it strikes the remainder of the page. Number four, the reimbursement provisions in the bill are stricken, except for the language allowing the members of the commission to be reimbursed for their actual expenses as
