LR 1

CLERK: (Read LB 239 on Final Reading.)

SENATOR CROSBY: All provisions of law having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 239 pass? All in favor vote aye, opposed no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read record vote. See pages 689-90 of the Legislative Journal.) 43 ayes, 0 nays, 2 present and not voting, 4 excused and not voting.

SENATOR CROSBY: LB 239 passes. We will now go back to LR 1.

CLERK: (Read LR 1CA on Final Reading.)

SENATOR CROSBY: All provisions of law having been complied with, the question is, shall LR 1CA pass? All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. This requires 40 votes to put it on the primary ballot because the primary ballot is in the...(inaudible). Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read record vote. See pages 690-91 of the Legislative Journal.) 41 ayes, 3 nays, 1 present and not voting, 4 excused and not voting.

SENATOR CROSBY: LR 1CA passes. That concludes Final Reading for this morning. We will go on to General File, LB 240, Senator Abboud. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Madam President, 240 was introduced by Senator Abboud and others. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 9 of this year, at that time referred to the Business and Labor Committee. The bill was discussed on the floor on January 25. It was bracketed at that time. I do have amendments pending.

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Abboud, would you like to bring us up to speed?

SENATOR ABOUD: Madam President, colleagues, when we last left this bill it was being bracketed to determine if Senator Hall's concerns could be addressed. Senator Hall has offered an amendment today that has been reviewed by the Department of Labor. They received a copy of the amendment, as did I this morning. Their initial review of the bill was that they felt that the two changes that Senator Hall is making with LB 240 would be fine with their department. They then, after reviewing
