SENATOR BROMM: That was my concern. Senator Hall is handing me something and maybe he has fit that together. Let me see if he could respond as well, if that would be okay. Senator Hall,...

SENATOR WILL: Senator Hall.

SENATOR BROMM: ...does Senator Preister's amendment fit okay with the committee amendments or do we...or are there other changes that would be needed?

SENATOR HALL: Mr. President and members, Senator Bromm, yes, because the amendment that is the committee amendment is one that I offered at the committee and it doesn't...it isn't inserted into line 18, so it would be down below the nonprofit organization and it basically makes a subsection of Section 3, and it would say, the second subsection of Section 3 would be the religious corporation exemption. Okay. And the committee amendments and Senator Preister's amendment, as it currently exists, are cohabitable...

SENATOR BROMM: Okay.

SENATOR HALL: ...for purposes of the bill. It does not create a problem. What we do with the committee amendments, in Section 3 we create two subsections, the first one being the section that Senator Preister is trying to amend with his amendment, and the second one being the committee amendment, the religious exclusion that I offered at committee. So they will fit together without any problem.

SENATOR BROMM: Okay, thank you, Senator Hall. I'll reserve other comments till we consider the bill. Thank you.

SENATOR WILL: Thank you, Senator Bromm. Senator Preister, on the first portion of your amendment.

SENATOR PREISTER: Thank you, Honorable President. Can you tell me, are there other lights on?

SENATOR WILL: Yes, there are.

SENATOR PREISTER: I will wait until closing.
