PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator. Any further discussion? Seeing none, Senator Dierks, do you wish to close?

SENATOR DIERKS: Thank you, Madam President, members of the body. The intent wasn't to drag the bill down. The intent was just to provide some protection and some added safety for the citizens of our state by way of some legislative language here. I would just ask your support for the amendment. Thank you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The question before the body is the adoption of the Dierks amendment to LB 830. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Senator Dierks.

SENATOR DIERKS: I would like to request a call of the house and let's just do a roll call vote in regular order please.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: There has been a request for a call of the house. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: 13 ayes, 0 nays to go under call.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The house is under call. Will senators please return to their seats. Will all unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. The house is under call. Senators, please check in. Lynch, Bohlke, Senator Bohlke, Senator Lynch. Senator Maurstad, will you check in please. Senator Pirsch, Senator Warner, Senator Schellpeper, Senator Landis. Senator Bohlke, will you check in please. Senator Landis, will you check in please. Senator Pirsch. Mr. Clerk, please proceed with the roll call vote.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 839 of the Legislative Journal.) 20 ayes, 21 nays, Madam President.
