

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Madam President, I would like a call of the house, please, and a roll call.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: There's been a request for a call of the house. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: 15 ayes, 0 nays to go under call.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The house is under call. Will senators please return to their seats. Will all unauthorized personnel please return (sic) to the floor. The house is under call. Senators, please check in. Senator Kristensen, will you check in, please. Senator Engel, will you check in, please. Senator Schimek, will you check in, please. Senator Hartnett, Senator Hillman. Senator Robinson, Senator Preister. Senator Lynch, Senator Matzke. Senator Hillman, will you check in, please. Senator Hartnett, Senator Matzke. Senator Robinson. We're waiting on Senators Robinson and Hartnett. There was a request for a roll call vote. Mr. Clerk, please proceed.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 861 of the Legislative Journal.) 17 ayes, 22 nays, Madam President.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Wickersham amendment fails. I raise the call. Mr. Clerk, the next amendment. While the Legislature is in session and capable of transacting business, I propose to sign and do hereby sign LR 54, LR 55 and LR 56.

CLERK: Madam President, the next amendment I have is by Senator Brashear. I understand Senator Lindsay is going to handle that for him. (The Brashear amendment, AM0612, appears on page 862 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Lindsay.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Thank you, Madam President, and members, I'm going to have the amendment passed around to you so you can see what it is, but in the meantime I will describe it to you and read it to you.
