will, for purposes of travel that's out there, and there needs to be a review process. But other than that, if there is a legitimate state interest, legitimate legislative interest, if an individual serves on a committee in the capacity that you mentioned in terms of the Judiciary Committee for ALEC that you serve on, those considerations should be met by the body that approves travel. If this bill passes, as I would hope it would, I would go about the process of developing that policy, we'd have time to do that between now and 1997, when it would take effect, and I think that it makes very good sense to proceed in that manner.

SENATOR PEDERSEN: Thank you. I serve on the Council of State Governments now as the Vice Chair, going to take my only title off of my stationary and my directory, but I don't really have a problem with that. I heard Senator Crosby talk the other day, and I too see it that we have an opportunity here to cut down a little bit at least on some bureaucracy even in our own body. And being a member of the committee I probably, like Senator Wesely, will probably support the...this committee being down because it will be a couple of years anyway, and I can still use up the stationary I have. Thank you.
