

SENATOR CHAMBERS: . . . a document, and I am not going to talk about the grammar and syntax, both of which are atrocious. They don't even know how people are elected to office, don't even know. What they ought to do, and I've suggested Senator Withem, Senator Kristensen, and whoever else work with these outfits, do is tell them to put together drafts of things they have, then turn it over to me for editing and final writing of it, so that, at least, it is factually correct and historically accurate. But my intent at this time is to support Senator Kristensen's amendment and, Senator Witek, I then probably will vote for the resolution, but I am going to listen very closely to what you are saying because when people have walked the path of matrimony and been through as much as we've been through together, you are entitled to have my undivided attention and you may...

SPEAKER WITHEM: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...even persuade me.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Kristensen, there are no further lights on. You are recognized to close.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature. You know, Senator Chambers, this discussion that you and Senator Witek have had, I'm sort of relieved. I am glad that the marriage has broken up because the thought of offsprings just scares me to death, and I don't think this state, I don't think this country is ready for that, and perhaps you've done everybody a favor. So with that, I still hope that after that discussion people are willing to vote for my amendment, and I'd urge the adoption of this. What it does, for those of you who have just come in, it changes some of the intent language. If there was any inflammatory intent language, I think it has been taken out. I think it still does the basics of what we need to do and I'd urge the adoption of this amendment. Thank you.
