

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: It does on the very...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...on the bill?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: ...on the very back page, Senator Chambers, page 4 of the committee statement, there's an explanation of committee amendments, one through four. Those are what the committee amendment does.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, and they don't deal with what it is I'm talking about now?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: I do not believe so.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. Even though we're on the committee amendments, I want to ask Senator Coordsen a question. Senator Coordsen, it's one thing...oh.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Coordsen.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Yes, I will respond.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: It's one thing to say that a person who is registering a vehicle is required to truthfully state that he or she does have coverage in these amounts, but suppose that is a true statement at the time, but between the time the person registers the vehicle and the time that they need to register again, which is a year away, the person allows the policy to lapse because he or she is not going to drive the vehicle anymore and it is not parked on the street. That person is still guilty of a crime for not maintaining insurance on a vehicle which is not to be driven. Isn't that true?

SENATOR COORDSEN: I could not answer that accurately, I think.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Here's...okay,...

SENATOR COORDSEN: I know that insofar as driving on a...driving without proof of insurance is an issue separate from the question that you asked.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But here's what I'm looking at, on page 3 of the bill,...
