

SENATOR JONES: Clear up to the voting delegate floor to make their policy. I was on the local Farm Bureau Board and we voted to see which ones we sent as delegates and we sent a number of delegates...

SENATOR BROMM: Very briefly, Madam President, once again the amendment I think is simply to clarify that the information, should there be any from the Attorney General, regarding the content of this bill is to be treated when it goes to the agency or the Governor the same as information given by an attorney to his client even though we're not saying that that relationship exists. Now that's the basis of the amendment. I think it clarifies the status of this advice and I would urge the body to adopt the amendment. Then we can discuss the merits of the bill further. As I said before, I think whether or not you favor or oppose the bill, I would encourage you to consider supporting the amendment. Thank you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Bromm. The question before you is the adoption of the Bromm amendment to the committee amendments to LB 168. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay. Please record.
