There is a question as to our voting process as to whether or not members can call in a change of their vote after the original vote has been made. It is my sense that Rule 7, Section 2, talking about voting, is somewhat unclear on that. I believe the Rules Committee probably needs to address that issue maybe more specifically to clarify it. At this point it is my sense that a member ought to have the right to change a vote anytime prior to its being finalized. So I will rule that Senator Chambers did in fact change his vote and is eligible to make a motion to reconsider. That is the ruling...I guess the ruling, at this point, is that Senator Chambers did have the right to change his vote and he will be listed on that vote as not voting.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Chambers changing from yes to not voting. 10 ayes, 24 nays on the motion to indefinitely postpone.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The bill is not indefinitely postponed. Senator Beutler, for what purpose do you rise?
