CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the advancement of LB 285.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: LB 285 advances. LB 589.

CLERK: LB 589, introduced by Senator Hall. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 18, referred to the Government Committee, advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Chair recognizes Senator Hall to open on the bill.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Madam President, members. The bill was introduced, it deals with a section of statute that regulates noxious weeds. It deals with the section of statute that deals with the sewage systems and the disposal plants related thereto. It also addresses the issue of the Nebraska Business Corporation Act and drainage districts, and it deals with irrigation districts as well as the Uniform Commercial Code. And the bill is rather broad in its approach, but it really only does one thing. It takes the reference to Nebraska Revised Statutes, as they are called, and they're dated 1943, out of the statute. Merely, what it does is it takes the year, 1943, off of the statutes. The Revisor of Statutes requested that because there was...has been confusion in the past. This will allow for the statutes to read as they do without the date that's attached to it. I would urge advancement to E & R Initial of LB 589.
