SPEAKER WITHEM: LB 337A advances. Mr. Clerk, LB 68A.

CLERK: LB 68A by Senator Schimek. (Read title.)

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Schimek.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, Mr. President, members of the body, this bill, as you recall, establishes the Breast and Cervical Cancer Cash Fund, simply for the purposes of moving cash that has been received from donations to doing diagnostic mammographies for low-income women, and that's all this bill does. It appropriates \$25,000 each of the next two fiscal years for the Breast and Cervical...from the Breast and Cervical Cancer Cash Fund. Any expenses to the department in administering this will be absorbed by the department.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Senator Schimek. Any discussion? Seeing none, any closing? I assume closing is waived. The question is the advancement of LB 68A. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President, on the advancement of 68A.

SPEAKER WITHEM: LB 68A is advanced. LB 178A.

CLERK: LB 178A offered by Senator Abboud. (Read title.)
