SPEAKER WITHEM: The bracket motion is defeated. The question now before the body is the advancement of LB 168 to E & R Initial. Roll call vote has been requested. Mr. Clerk, call the roll.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See pages 1482-83 of the Legislative Journal.) 33 ayes, 11 nays on the motion to advance the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The bill is advanced. The call is raised. I would like to recognize, in the north balcony, 45 fourth graders from Woodland Elementary School in Norfolk, guests of Senator Day, and their teacher. Would you please stand and be recognized. And hot off the press we have Student Government Day for District 24, from Centennial High School in Utica, Milford High School in Milford, Bradshaw High School in Bradshaw, from Senator Stuhr's district, in the south balcony. Would you folks all rise too, please. Mr. Clerk, LB 425.

CLERK: Mr. President, 425 was a bill originally introduced by Senator Engel at the request of the Governor and a number of members. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 12, referred to the Banking Committee, advanced to General File. Mr. President, the bill was reported to General File. Committee amendments have been adopted on March 23. Senator Bernard-Stevens had an amendment to the bill adopted, as did...Senator Bernard-Stevens had two amendments; Senator Wesely had an amendment. When the Legislature left the issue, Mr. President, Senator Chambers had moved to indefinitely postpone, and I believe that motion is now pending.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, Senator Engel, I am furious about what just happened but I don't carry how I feel on one issue over to the other and I'm going to withdraw that motion.
