

Senator. That prevailed. Senator Chambers, I have an amendment that's found on page 1285 of the Journal, Senator, offered by yourself. Yes, sir, LB 830 enacted by the Ninety-fourth Legislature, First Session, is hereby repealed.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, I want to take that one.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Members of the Legislature, I am as serious as a heart attack on this amendment. This bill that I'm proposing to repeal is the main Micron bill, LB 830. And in addition to disliking the philosophy behind the giveaways, this bill is so poorly drafted, so poorly crafted that it should never have been enacted on that basis alone. One of the things that it will allow, and Senator Jones is ducking out of the building now, go on, Senator Jones, that's all right. You all are so concerned about takings. I'm going to show the hypocrisy of this body. You're so concerned about takings. This bill allows the state to take private property from one private landowner and give it to another so it can be given to a big corporation. Now if you're serious about what you did before and it's not part of a right-wing hidden agenda, how are you going to keep LB 830 in place? There are provisions in that bill which now is the law that takes away the limit of how much property can be declared blighted and substandard within a city. Under the existing law, prior to LB 830, a limit of 35 percent existed. What was done with LB 830 in the haste to enact it was to put in a provision saying that any other provision of the law conflicting with LB 830 is overridden. Since people don't know what is in 830, they don't know what all has been overridden. That is a very bad proposition to put into a piece of legislation as far-reaching as 830 was. What this bill...what this motion that I'm offering would do is to repeal that law. I think that Nebraska ought to be ashamed of how it prostrated itself and prostituted the process of the Legislature. I'm working on a rhyme, colleagues, about that shameful exercise. But after Nebraska laid itself out in front of Micron, shamelessly and shamefully, Micron thumbed its nose, gave Nebraska the back of the hand and treated Nebraska like a tawdry, used harlot. The third time that Nebraska has been slapped aside. BMW, there was another one, and somebody is going to tell me what it was.
