SENATOR CROSBY: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But I will not impede its movement this morning.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Any further discussion on advancement of LB 65? Seeing none, the question is, shall LB 65 advance to E & R Engrossing? All those in favor say aye. Opposed no. It is advanced. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Madam President, the next issue before the Legislature, LR 3. Senator Kristensen would move to return the resolution for specific amendment. The amendment is on page 961 of the Journal. (AM0682.)

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Before I ask Senator Kristensen to open, I would like to call the Legislature's attention to the north balcony. Senator Pedersen has as his guests 41 fourth graders from Aldrick Elementary in Omaha with their teacher. Would you please stand and be recognized by your Legislature. Senator Kristensen to open on your motion.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Thank you. Madam President, members of the Legislature, I apologize for I've got two bills in a row here. This particular amendment I hope is not as controversial as the last one was, even though it wasn't my amendment, but it was my bill that took some time this morning. This is LR 3CA. This is the last of the constitutional amendments that were removed from the November ballot last year, and the amendment is the one that has been placed on the other ones, and that is to have the primary election in May of 1996 and allow us to take a vote on whether it should be done in May, and if we don't do it, then it would return to November, and I'd ask for adoption of the amendment.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Kristensen. Any discussion on the Kristensen motion? Seeing none, did you have anything further? The question is whether LR 3 should be returned to Select File for specific amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the motion to return the bill.
