

Schellpeper. Senator Schrock, Senator Elmer, Senator Fisher, Senator Vrtiska, Senator Kristensen. Senator Bernard-Stevens, Senator Maurstad said that we can proceed. Do you mind if we proceed with a roll call vote? I'm sorry, Senator. Time. Okay, because we are in the middle of a vote, we will proceed with the vote. Senator Maurstad, we will proceed with the vote, because we are in the middle of a vote. We can proceed. The question before you is ceasing debate on the advancement of LB 193.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See pages 1659-60 of the Legislative Journal.) 35 ayes, 3 nays to cease debate, Madam President.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Debate ceases. The question before you is the advancement of LB 193. All those in favor vote...Senator Bernard-Stevens.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: I believe the time has expired on the bill. Is that correct?

PRESIDENT ROBAK: That is correct, Senator.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: So I assume we're moving to the next bill.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Well, Senator, we opened on this bill. We finished the debate within the time frame.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Yes, but there...the gentleman is not closing at this point and so, consequently, you have to be closing before the time ends.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Withem, would...it's my understanding, as on the Speaker's consent calendar, that this is the procedure that you have set forth and as such it is...I would ask you if that's your opinion. It is mine from this seat.

SPEAKER WITHEM: I would, I guess, my sense, and I assume as opposed to parliamentary you're interpreting this as an agenda item...

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Yes, Senator.

SPEAKER WITHEM: ...and I am reading literally if the debate
