ASSISTANT CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance 514 to E & R Initial.

SENATOR HALL: LB 514 advances. Before we move to the next bill, I'd like to introduce guests of Senator Maurstad. Actually they are family members under the north balcony, his sister Debra Dreher and her sons, Adam and Eric. Would you please stand and be recognized by the Legislature. Thank you for joining us today. Mr. Clerk, next item on the agenda, LB 669.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Mr. President, LB 669 was introduced by Speaker Withem. (Title read.) The bill was read for the first time on January 19, referred to the Government Committee. That committee reports the bill to General File with committee amendments.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Senator Robinson, to open on the committee amendments.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Mr. President, members of the body, this bill deals with the requirement that a county attorney must reside in the county in which he or she holds office. The committee amendment would retain this requirement except that the county attorney serving in a county that does not have a city of the metropolitan, primary or first class may reside in an adjoining Nebraska county. So it would be counties that have under 5,000 population and I would urge the adoption of the committee amendments.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Senator Robinson. Is there any discussion of the adoption of the committee amendments? Seeing none, the question is, shall the committee amendments be adopted? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of committee amendments.

SENATOR HALL: The committee amendments are adopted.
