It also requires city or village to propagate (sic) the rules and regulation to the neighborhood association registration process. And it simply does...specifies the mailing process to neighborhood association. And with that, I'd try to answer any questions, would simply ask that the amendment be accepted.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Hartnett. Any discussion on the committee amendments? Seeing none, Senator Hartnett, would you like...he waives closing. The question is the adoption of the committee amendments to LB 140. All in favor vote aye, opposed no. We're voting on the committee amendments to LB 140. Record.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to adopt committee amendments.

SENATOR CROSBY: The committee amendments are adopted. Anything further?

ASSISTANT CLERK: Nothing further on the bill.

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Preister, on the bill.

SENATOR PREISTER: Thank you, Honorable President, friends all. As Senator Hartnett said, the concern that I have is for notification of people who are being affected by changes that may take place in their community. Simply what the bill, which the committee amendments have taken the place of, would do is provide that the cities would send a notification directly to a neighborhood association. It would be the responsibility of that neighborhood association, should they exist in the particular community, to register with the city clerk. Once they were registered and they were notifying that community that they wanted to receive the notice they would then be put on the mailing list. If no such agency registered, if no such neighborhood association existed there would be no requirements for the municipality to do such. So it's only where the neighborhood already has an organized activity present that this would go into effect, and then it would simply provide for either...and it would be at the choice of the municipality, a registered letter or simply a first class letter. And it might be to the best interests of the municipality to send it registered so they have verification that they actually did do
