

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Vrtiska.

SENATOR VRTISKA: We could stand here and discuss this together but I would like to get it on the record. (Laughter.)

SENATOR CROSBY: You want to be Sonny and Cher again, I know.

SENATOR VRTISKA: No, I just have one question, Senator Crosby, and that relates to you said that they would be permanent residents and I was wondering how do you establish... I guess my thought was if somebody just moved into a motel and stayed for 30 days, they could get their license and then...

SENATOR CROSBY: No, you...

SENATOR VRTISKA: ...okay, you explain...

SENATOR CROSBY: No you have to have some other...there are other indications, I'll say, or things that make it...make it that you are a permanent resident. You buy a home or rent a home, you're paying taxes, you get a driver's license, and people could do that, I will admit, but I think that is somewhat...if you're living in a motel and don't have any established residence, Game and Parks is going to question that.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Okay, that's...I just wanted that on the record because I knew that's what you would say but I appreciate that because I think that people would have some objection to somebody doing that and what you tried to do is make sure they are permanent residents. With that, thank you.

SENATOR CROSBY: Right. Thank you.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Crosby, nobody else wishes to speak, do you care to close?

SENATOR CROSBY: No, thank you.
